The third annual Future Stages Festival last June brought together nearly 800 youth artists to perform in Muriel Kauffman Theatre, Helzberg Hall, and an additional outdoor stage. Future Stages Festival will be held at the Kauffman Center on Sunday, June 25, 2017 from 11am – 4pm. This one-day festival showcases Kansas City's diversity, bringing together visitors from all over the metro area to enjoy interactive arts activities and performances featuring young artists. As an extension of the Kauffman Center's Open Doors *Spotlight on Youth* program, the festival gives youth and community arts organizations the opportunity to perform and celebrate the arts at the Kauffman Center.

## CALL FOR APPLICATIONS FOR YOUTH PERFORMERS

Applications are now being accepted for young performers and youth performance groups to be a part of the upcoming Future Stages Festival. Community arts organizations and school programs are encouraged to apply. Performance groups should be comprised primarily of youth performers between the ages of 5 - 18, and must have a minimum of 5 performers. Strong consideration will be given to larger groups (25+).

- Registration is optional. No tickets will be issued. Once registered, attendees will automatically qualify for a drawing to win two tickets to an upcoming performance at the Kauffman Center.

- All ages are welcome and programming is suggested as most suitable for families with youth ages 4 - 15.
