Assistive Listening Devices at the Kauffman Center

The Kauffman Center for the Performing Arts offers patrons three different Assistive Listening Device options: earbuds, a neckworn T-coil loop for enabled hearing aids, and the option to bring your own headphones. Patrons may request these devices at the Gift Shop in Brandmeyer Great Hall.

- Our provided earbuds rest in the ears and connect to a lightweight volume knob. Since they are designed to sit in (not over) your ears, they might not work with hearing aids.
- Our neck-worn T-coil loop transmitters are worn like a necklace and will transmit sound to your T-coil enabled hearing aid.
- If you own a pair of headphones or earbuds, you can check out a device and plug your headphones in.

Our Assistive Listening Devices rely on direct line-of-sight technology to receive the audio signal. This means that if the devices are underneath a scarf or accidentally worn backwards, no sound will transmit to the devices. Please make sure your volume knob is facing the stage.
